REACH FOR THE STARS



The Stella Maris Leadership Award aims to help you shine and thrive to be a well-rounded individual and ready for your next steps.

There are three levels of the award: bronze, silver and gold. Each award is recognised by a star shaped badge, and certificate.









To earn your Stella Maris Leadership Awards, you need to achieve virtue commendations. These are awarded by your teachers and documented electronically. You will also record your progress in your Stella Maris Leadership Award log book to make sure you are on track to achieve an award. Below is a breakdown of what virtues and activities you need to complete. Good luck!

Achieve the criteria for the bronze **and** silver awards.



Achieve at least **four** virtue commendations: at least **one** from **each of the four** virtue categories.

Complete an innovative project or organise an event independently and provide evidence for this.

Speak to your PTE teacher about this.

Achieve excellent PTE attendance – showing outstanding commitment to developing yourself emotionally, spiritually and intellectually beyond your chosen academic courses.

Complete a logbook including four virtue reviews and a reflection on your Gold award project.

Achieve the criteria for the bronze award.

Complete at least **5-6 hours of volunteering** or participation and provide evidence for this.

Achieve excellent PTE attendance – showing outstanding commitment to developing yourself emotionally, spiritually and intellectually beyond your chosen academic courses.

In your log book, complete **four** detailed virtue reviews.

Achieve at least **one** civic virtue commendation for **service** or **responsible citizenship**.



Achieve at least **one** other virtue commendation, from any category. Excellent PTE attendance – showing outstanding commitment to developing yourself emotionally, spiritually and intellectually beyond your chosen academic courses.

In your log book, complete **two** detailed virtue reviews.

Notre Dame Catholic Sixth Form College is the only Catholic sixth form in Leeds and was founded by the Sisters of Notre Dame in 1898 to provide education for the disadvantaged and poor in the community. It is with immense pride that we share this heritage with all our staff and students.

Our mission, inspired by the Christian tradition, is to be a community based on faith, hope, and love. We believe education is about the holistic formation of the whole person, developing each individual intellectually, emotionally, and spiritually, to help equip them to live life to the fullest. To achieve this mission, and inspired by the work of the Jubilee Centre Framework for Character Education in Schools (2017) and Virtues for Catholic Schools, a research project for the Diocese of Leeds (2018), we created a student leadership award based on virtues aimed at developing 'good character'.

The Stella Maris Leadership Award, based on the Intellectual, Moral, Civic, and Performance Catholic virtues, is now a nationally recognised programme. We designed the award to cultivate the habits and virtues in students necessary to be well-rounded individuals who can meet the challenges of the 21st century, navigate life, and demonstrate stewardship. Ultimately, the aim is for each member of the College community to practice the virtues to become 'my best self,' to develop good sense or practical wisdom, and to reflect on how to be shining lights of good character.

To lay the foundation for good character, we believe we need to create an environment in which students gain virtue literacy through both the teaching of virtues such as respect, perseverance, and responsibility, and the opportunities to practice and apply these skills in college, at home, and in the community. All students work towards the Gold Level, and through the teachings in Core RE, supported by the curriculum and tutorials, they learn about the virtues and how these can be acquired through deliberate acts.

The Stella Maris Leadership Award underpins the commitment to Catholic Social Teaching through the development and acting out of virtues.


